AMP visits the Collierville Powerhouse

Hydropower is energy in moving water! Ever wonder where Alameda's 100% clean power comes from? AMP staff had the opportunity to visit one of our clean power investments – the Collierville Powerhouse, Northern California Power Agency's (NCPA) hydroelectric power plant located in Murphys, CA. At the powerhouse, giant turbines propelled by falling water create clean power that is carried 40 miles on NCPA high voltage power lines, to interconnect with the transmission system and deliver electricity to the City of Alameda. Thanks, Northern California Power Agency, for showing our team how clean and renewable hydroelectric power is transformed into electricity!



Line Crew Training Day

Safety First! On this foggy morning, AMP's line crew got in some pole-top rescue training, an important safety procedure if a fellow line crew member becomes unconscious or unresponsive due to electric shock. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) states that in the event of a rescue, only line workers are qualified to safely climb the pole and lower the injured worker. Due to the hazards associated with line workers' jobs, a safely executed pole-top rescue could end up saving the victim's life. LIGHT Savers and LIFE Savers, indeed!
