



MOVING FOWARD

It's been a busy four months for Alameda's District Nomination Board (DNB), which is identifying districts that would benefit from moving their utility lines underground. Since its first meeting in June, the DNB, composed of four members of the public and one member from the Public Works Department, has narrowed down the areas being considered for undergrounding to 14 locations.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

The DNB's recommendations will go to a Technical Advisory Committee for evaluation. The committee will then

make recommendations on districts to the City Council, for its determination.

AMP, which administers the city's undergrounding program, plans to start construction in the districts in fiscal year 2018, after the public process is complete and districts have been chosen. Keep an eye out for information on an upcoming survey and town hall meeting.

WOOD POLE TESTING TO BEGIN IN JANUARY

Starting in early January and running through the first half of the new year, third-party contractors for AMP will examine wood power-line poles to check on their safety.
